Chairwoman's Report

This year has been better than 2017. The biggest change was that we experimented with meetings during the summer months. We were not sure what to expect, but the experiment was a success and we are continuing with summer meetings.

More people are attending meetings and fortunately this year we have not had to cancel any because of the weather. However the number of members remains comparatively low. Unfortunately the costs of speakers continues to rise. This year we have made a slight increase in the cost of joint subscriptions from £16 to £18 and next year we propose to increase the entrance fee for non-members from £2 to £3.

We had successful exhibitions at the Family History Fair and at the Local History Day at the Museum. This year we took part in the Christmas Tree Festival at the Crooked Spire and were pleased to hear that our tree attracted a great deal of attention.

This year we reprinted the *Brampton Feast* which was originally produced by the Brampton Living History Group. What's in prospect for this year? The Family History Fair is again in May and we are hoping to take part in the Whittington Gala in June. The *Newsletter* continues to appear bi-monthly and a new *Journal* will be coming out shortly.

I couldn't manage without the support of the committee. Thank you all.

Treasurer's Report

Expenditure is up largely accounted for by increases in room hire (more meetings), costs of speakers and printing of *Brampton Feast* and the *Journal*.

Income is also up with an increase in tea donations; sales from publications particularly from the sales of *Brampton Feast*, a small increase in membership subscriptions and a big increase in the income from visitors.

The net result is a healthy increase in the amount in the bank.
