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these machines have survived to the present day and the Chesterfield wheel (tree-ring dated to 1360-1400) is unusual in being easily accessible in a museum rather than still high up in the tower of its church.

This type of windlass is known to have been used as early as Roman times, and the principle behind it (the changing of rotational motion into vertical motion) underlies later powered machinery: for example the equipment used to raise coal from underground workings.

The Medieval Builders Wheel

This amazing object was used over 600 years ago in the building of Chesterfield's famous Crooked Spire church. If you've ever wondered how churches, cathedrals, and castles could be built without modern cranes, here's your answer. Heavy building materials were attached to a rope wound round the axle of the windlass, and then lifted by a person getting inside and treading the wheel around. The wheel was installed as high up on the building as possible and would be dismantled and moved up again as construction progressed. The medieval carpenters marked each piece of timber so they could easily take it apart and put it back together again. Very few of

THE DERWENT & HOWDEN DAMS by Keith Blood


Learn about the story of the construction of the Derwent and Howden Dams in this authoratitive talk by Keith Blood.

Issued in 1920 it gives details of some of the young men associated with Chesterfield Parish Church who fought during World War One. It gives the details not only of the young men who gave their lives but also of those who returned stating 'they were just as ready and willing to make the supreme sacrifice as those who died at the Front, and it is therefore fitting that without any distinction, a record should be kept of all those who responded to the call of duty.'



Backed in cloth covers the book was sold at Mr Newton Wrights Cavendish Street Chesterfield at a cost of 7s 6d


Pages include details of service and usually a photograph. Men who did not return are surrounded by a laurel wreath.
